# Message from President & Co-Founder

Dear Family of Amigos de Jesús (friends, benefactors, staff and especially children),

This is the first formal "annual report" we have put together in 22 years. We have always been very conscientious of balancing donor's wishes with the needs of the children, and always have had a professional annual audit of our revenue and expenses. But two sensitivities have prevented us from formally publishing what most annual reports contain:

- 1. Our Mission Statement centers on reflecting the attitude of Jesus Christ (Philippians 2.5) to both our children and benefactors. So while we personally thank each donor, we have refrained from publicizing names (something that most annual reports do) following Christ's command to "not let your left hand know what your right is doing" (Mt 6.3) your gift is between you and God.
- 2. Honduras is a dangerous country (the largest city closest to us, San Pedro Sula, once known as the "murder capital of the world"), and our foremost concern is for the safety of the children and the staff at Amigos de Jesús. By publishing a report detailing our revenue and expenses we could be inviting danger by having someone in Honduras think our Hogar/Home would be an easy target.

Having said all of this, I hope you know that whether you are a benefactor for 22 years or one year, Amigos de Jesús would not exist without you, and our children know this. As I have said often, "their lips are close to God's ear", so whether your name is specifically mentioned or

heartfully mentioned each night as the children gather to pray – your name comes from their lips to God's ear.

Anyone who wishes to receive the 2019 annual report in order to see how we steward your generosity can contact the Amigos de Jesús office and we will send you the report – just do not send it to your cousin in San Pedro [5]!



#### A Reflection from Benefactor Patricia St. Martin

I made my first trip to Amigos de Jesús in Honduras in October of 2014. The seven trips I have made since then have provided me with a unique opportunity to get to know many of the children, volunteers and staff at the Hogar.

One of my favorite parts of each trip is the overwhelming greeting given by the children and adults at the entrance gate area when we arrive.

On my last trip in April 2019, several of the older girls wrote out a welcome greeting on a long strip of paper that they held up while we entered the gate. The first words they said to me were "welcome home". Those sincere words touched my heart more than I can express.

The resiliency of the children is inspiring as they work through the pain they have experienced in their lives and learn to trust and love. The support from their sponsors is treasured by each of them.





They ask about our families and learn about our lives through the pictures we share with them. I am privileged to witness the growth of the children I sponsor. Those cute little kids I met so many years ago are now confident teenagers.

I want them to know that I'm in their corner, interested in their educational progress and spiritual growth and support their aspirations for the future. I believe that every sponsor plays a critical part in the life of the child they support. I hold my children close in my heart and daily prayers.
